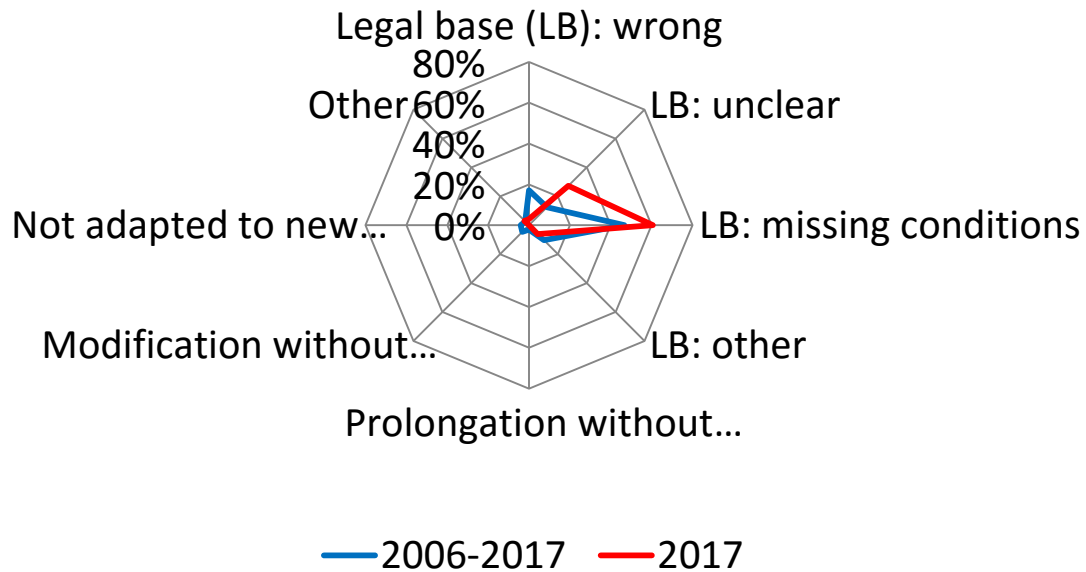

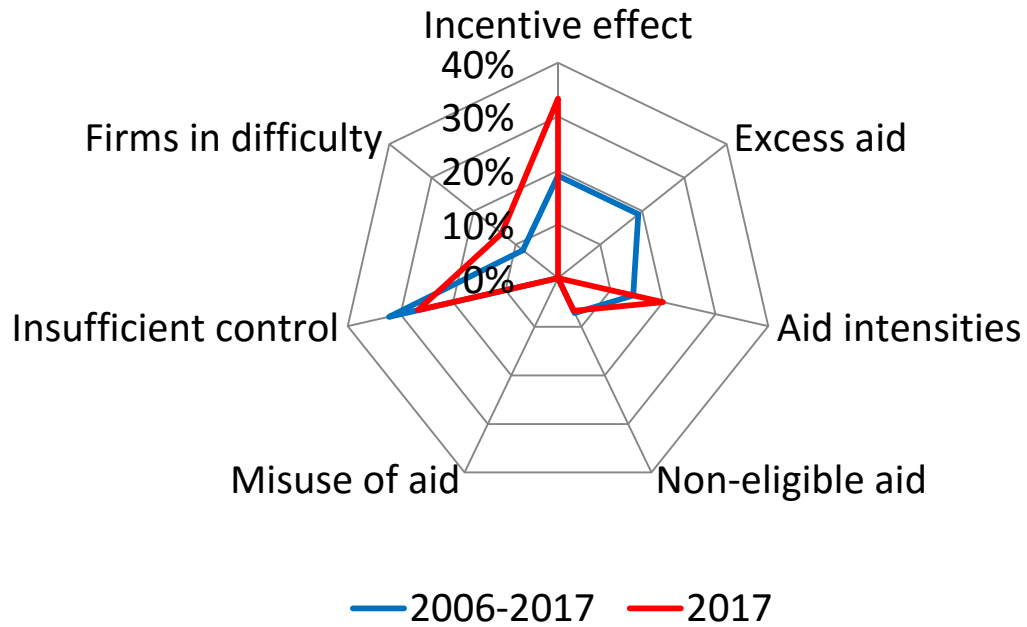

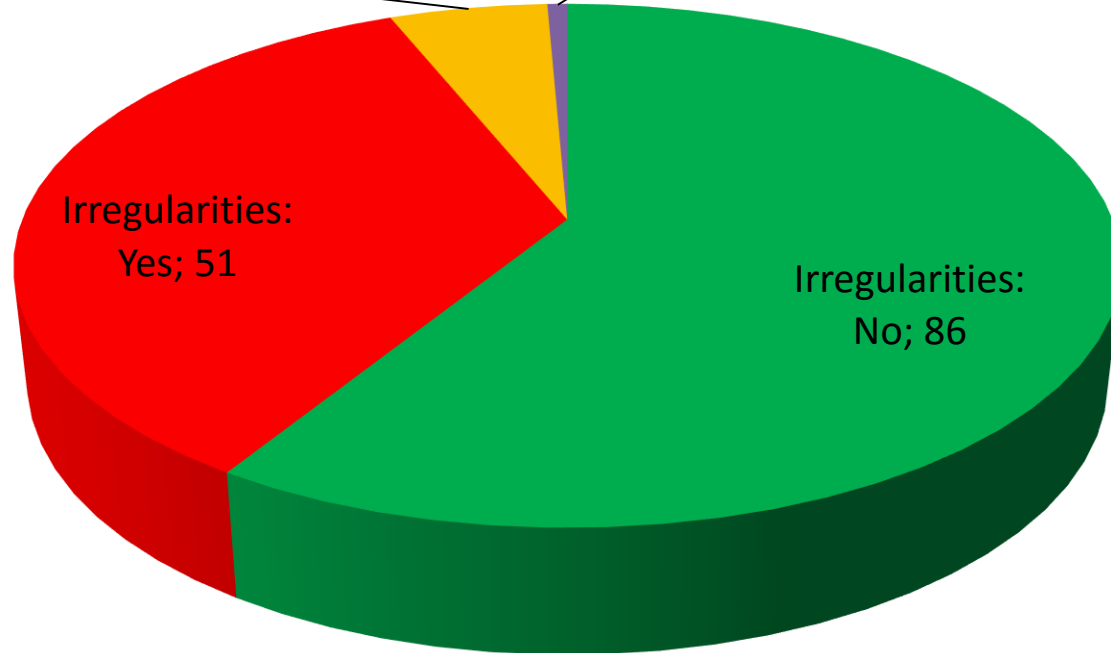


Environmental aid schemes monitored and overall result

(2006 - 2017)

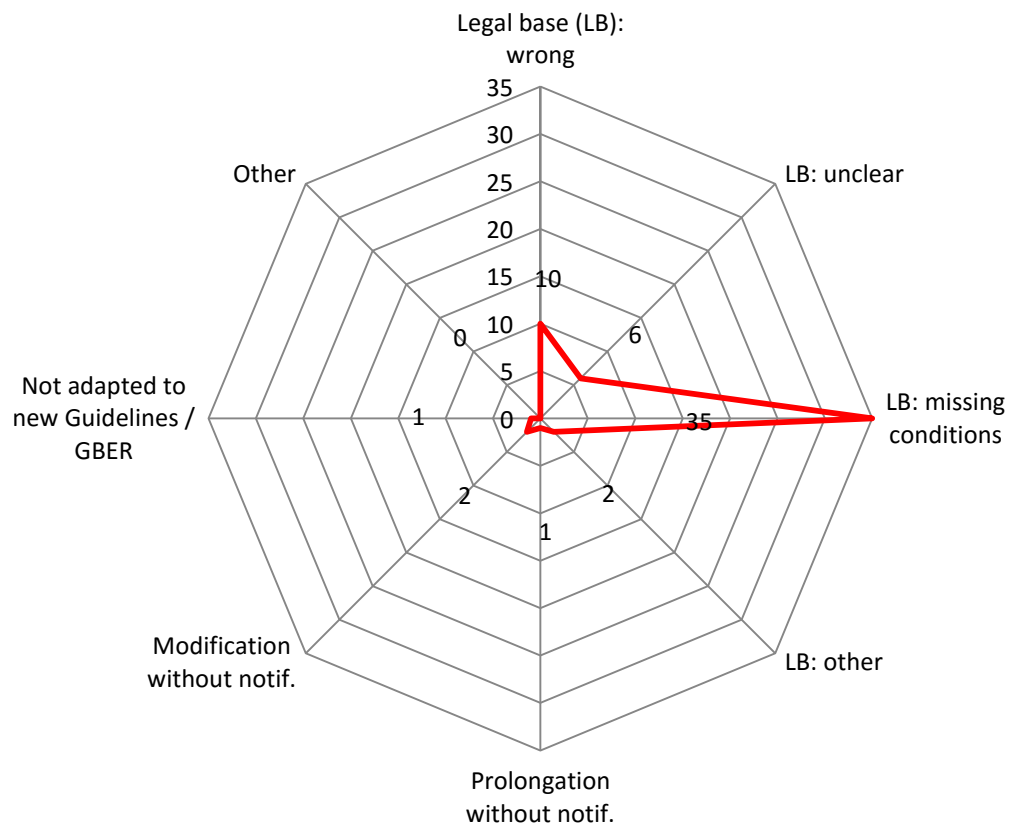

Environmental aid : Frequently made mistakes with respect to legal basis

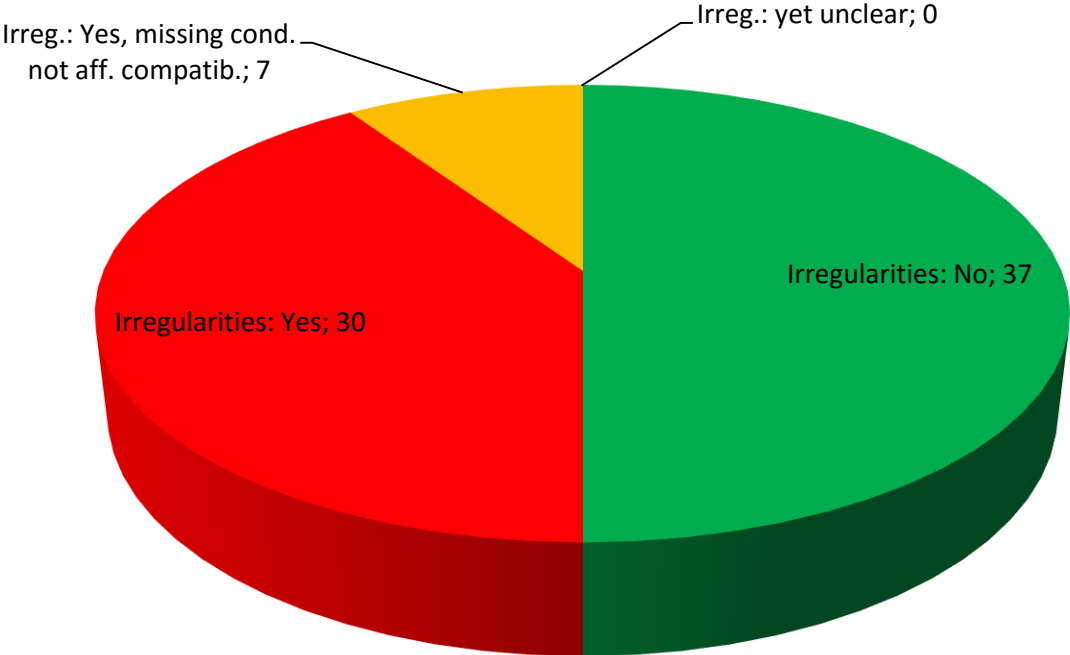

Environmental aid: Irregularities in the implementation

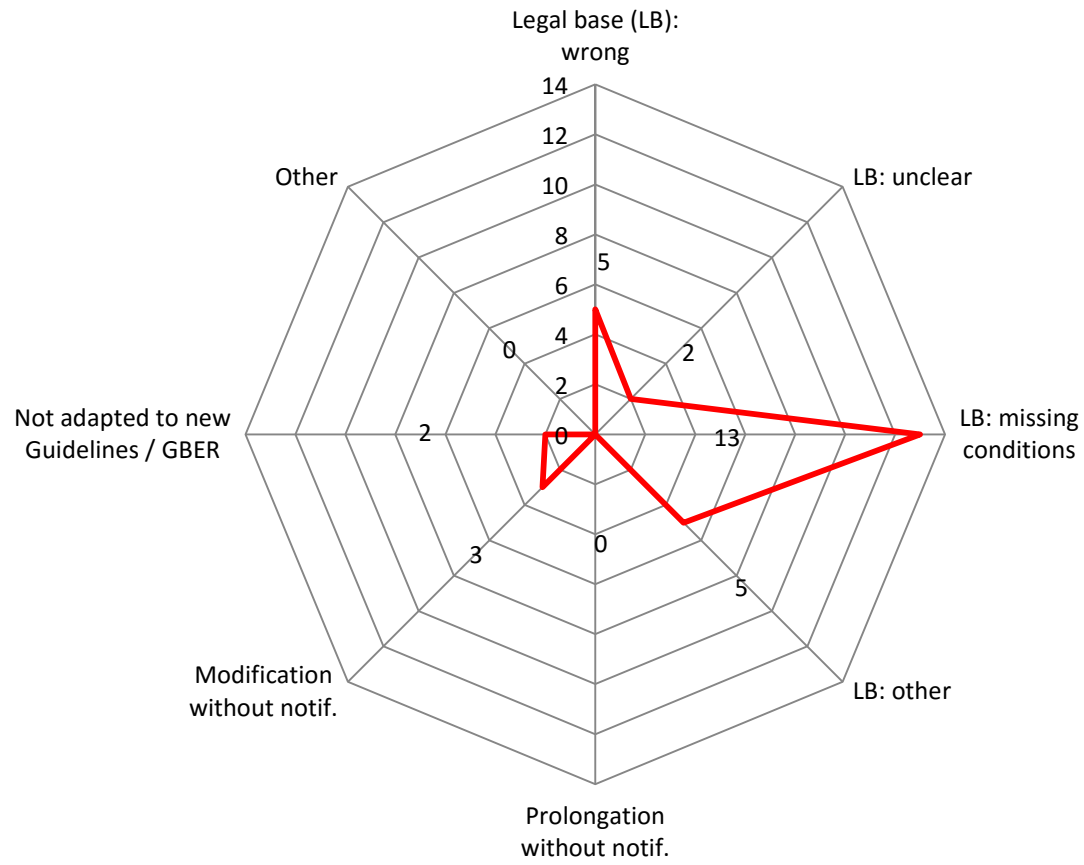


R&D&I Schemes monitored and overall result (2006 - 2017)



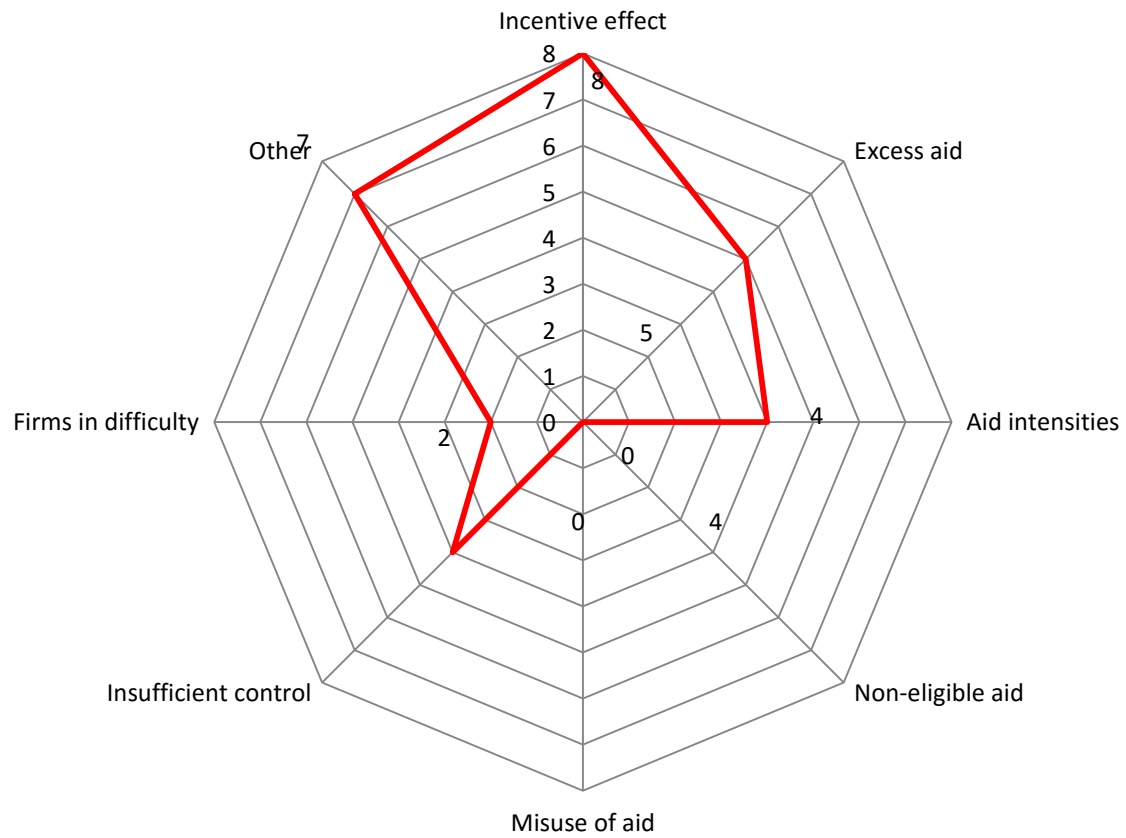

Conclusions

- Ex post monitoring is integral part of the decentralisation of state aid

- Predictable mistakes are avoidable mistakes
 - Many of the irregularities are not about interpretation of provisions of GBER => they are predictable, therefore, avoidable
